Ziegenhagan, in the state of Saatzig, Western Pomerania

The Beyer-Nennemann-Ziegenhagen family came from the area around the farming village of Ziegenhagen in Western Pomerania which was a province within the Kingdom of Prussia (northern Germany). After WW-II, this area became part of Poland. Today Ziegenhagen is known as Rybecki.

His daughter Maria Louisa Nennemann (b. abt. 1812—d. unk.) was born in Ziegenhagen, state of Saatzig, Western Pomerania.

Maria Louisa married Wilhelm Carl Beyer (c. 1803-1892) on January 31, 1833 in the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Ziegenhagen. Their marriage is the first mention of a "Beyer" in Ziegenhagen.

Their 8 children, all born in Ziegenhagen, included:

Friedrich Wilhelm Beyer (1833-1920) the oldest son of Wilhelm Carl Beyer & Maria Louisa Nennemann Beyer

Friedrich married Hanne (Johanna) Friedricke Tugendreich Saecker (1836-1909)

on November 25, 1858 in the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Ziegenhagen.

They arrived in the United States on June 11, 1867 on the Ship Jupiter and settled on a farm bordering Green Lake, WI. Friedrich's parents, Wilhelm and Maria Louisa Nennemann Beyer and Friedrich's younger brother Carl Gottlieb Beyer emigrated with them.

(Carl) August Wilhelm Beyer (1837-1900) Third child of Wilhelm Carl Beyer & Maria Louisa Nennemann

August married Sophia Dorothea Ziegenhagen (1837-1917) on June 22, 1863 in the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Ziegenhagen.

August and Sophia had three children that were born in Ziegenhagen. (1) Friedrich Beyer (b. Sept. 19, 1863—d. 1868) (2) Baby Beyer (b. Dec. 26, 1864—d. Dec. 26, 1864) (3) Auguste Wilhelmina "Minnie" Beyer (b. Aug. 28 1866—d. 1899 WI.)

August and Sophia emigrated to the United States on the Ship "Agnes" arriving in New York in June 1868. Their five year old son Friedrich died from the black pox on board ship. Their two year old daughter Minnie survived the arduous journey.

After their arrival in the port of New York, August and Sophia and their daughter Wilhelmina joined August's older brother Friedrich and August's father and mother at the farm they were establishing on Green Lake WI.

Around 1871, the August Beyer family moved from Green Lake to a farm in the Town of Burnett, Dodge County WI. August and Sophia had seven more children, all born in Wisconsin:



In October 1868, August Beyer became a citizen of the United States by making a declaration of intent to the Clerk of the Circuit Court in Green County, Wisconsin.

Green Lake County, August O personally appeared before the subscriber, the Clerk of the Circuit Court for the State of Wisfonsin for said County, on or about the year 18.38, that he emigrated to the United States, and landed at the port of hew your 18.58, that it is bona fide his intention to become a CITIZEN OF THE FATES, and to renounce forever all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign Prince, Potentate, State or Sovereignty whatever, and, particularly to peluch ing Oneono whereof he is a subject. Sophia Ziegenhagen Beyer (b. Mar. 20, 1837--d. Oct. 25,1917) Born in Ziegenhagen, State of Saatzig, Pomerania.

Her father was Christian Ziegenhagen.

Sophia probably had a brother, August Wilhelm Ziegenhagen, who lived with his wife Dorothea and family in Minnesota Junction, WI. They emigrated in 1882 to the United States on the ship "Koln".



Martin's first marriage to Eva Hitzel took place on Aug. 19, 1732 in Brettheim, state of Wurttemberg, Germany. Martin's second marriage to Eva Anna Catharina Mulfinger took place on Feb. 17, 1750 in Brettheim, state of Wurttemberg, Germany.

> Martin & Eva Anna Mulfinger's son Georg Michael Schott (b. Feb. 1, 1752—d. Sept. 19, 1817) was born in Brettheim, state of Wurttemberg, Germany.

Georg Michael married **Eva Margaretha** on June 19, 1786 in Brettheim. He died in Schmalfelden, Wurttemberg in 1817.

Georg Michael & Eva Margaretha's son Georg Michael Schott, Jr. was born on May 4, 1788 in Kleinbarenweiler, Wurttemberg.

Brettheim, Kleinbarenweiler and Schmalfelden are very small villages close to each other in the county of Schwabisch Hall, state of Wurttemberg.

Georg Michael Jr.'s <u>first</u> marriage to (Eva) Margaretha Stroebel (b. Feb. 6, 1785–d. unk.) took place on Apr. 17, 1814 in Gerabronn, Hausen am Bach u. Oa, Wurttemberg.

Three of their children died before the age of 1: Margaretha (1814), Margaretha Barbara (1817); and Katharina Barbara (1818).

Georg Michael Jr. & Margaretha Stroebel's son Johann Leonhard Schott was born March 13, 1815 in Kleinbarenweiler.

Johann Leonhard married Maria Margaretha Blumenstock on Sept. 28, 1845 in Wiesenbach. Their children included: Maria Margaretha (1845)

Johann & Maria applied to emigrate to the United States in March 1854.

Georg Michael Schott Jr.'s second marriage to Anna Katharina Kilian (b. Jan. 26, 1798 —d. Feb. 10, 1876) occurred on Feb. 28, 1821 in Schmalfelden, Wurttemberg.
